Principal's Report

New Vice Principal starting on Monday: - Jordie Hofstede-Barker (not french speaking)

Mr. Kolodzinski presented an overview of the KPR Mathematics - Scope and sequencing chart for grades K-12. He was formerly a math itinerant teacher and Math Coach for the Board.

- Scope the depth of what is taught
- Sequence the order in which things are taught
- The chart is adopted board wide
 - Allows teachers to see what would have been taught in previous grades and where learning is headed
 - Standard across the board that everyone learns the same things at the same time
- Strategic teaching (will receive handouts via email)
 - Teaching through problem soling
 - Engaging the mathematician
 - Computational fluency
- Portrayal of who is a mathematician in society
 - Focus on making students and teachers feel empowered about doing math and building positive attitudes toward math
- Examples of making math fun and incorporating it at home
 - Estimation vase (online)
 - Headbandz using regular deck of cards people holding the cards get the answer for what the two cards multiplied would equal. The people holding the cards then guess what card number they have. Can also use this for addition and subtraction.
- Helping parents support math at home

- Mathletes
